BOIL WATER ADVISORY LIFTED

THE BOIL WATER ADVISORY HAS BEEN LIFTED

The City of Montpelier, in consultation with the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), is pleased to announce that the **Precautionary Boil Water Advisory has been lifted** for all customers served by the City of Montpelier water system.

Water quality samples collected throughout the distribution system have been tested by a certified laboratory, and **all results came back negative**, confirming that the City's drinking water is safe for normal use. The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality has authorized the City to lift the advisory.

What Should Residents Do?

As a precaution, the City recommends that residents flush their household plumbing to remove any chlorinated or stagnant water that may have remained in the lines during the advisory.

To flush your system:

- Turn on each cold water faucet and let the water run for approximately 5 to 10 minutes, or until the chlorine odor has diminished.
- Discard any ice that was made during the advisory and make a fresh batch.
- Flush refrigerator water lines and replace water filters if recommended by the manufacturer.

The City has increased chlorine levels within the water system to ensure public health and safety. Some customers may notice a slight chlorine smell or taste for a short period. This is normal and will dissipate as the system returns to normal operation.

Although the advisory has been lifted, the City will continue collecting additional water quality samples over the coming days as an added precaution to ensure the continued safety and reliability of the water system.
